A motion was M/S/C to give our January offering to Main Street Living and our February offering to the American Bible Society, who was offering a triple match of funds received. We dedicated our mites with the printed prayer on page 7 of our group's booklet.

Committee Reports: Christian Life reported a board meeting on Feb. 24 at St. John's, NYA and an upcoming district meeting in Mankato. The Funeral Committee reported that 190 were served at Ella Molnau's funeral. The Martha Group will serve Margie Wolter's funeral on Monday, February 12. A motion was M/S/C to have our serving groups make the coffee and use our cups to insure its staying warm.

Unfinished Business: Our 2024 program books were completed in January, thanks largely to Roxanne Pieper. We also thank Roxanne for the work done on the military books.
