## **YOUR HELP IS NEEDED:**

Zion Ladies Aid and Lutheran Women’s Missionary League (LWML) is active at Zion! Perhaps we’re not a flashy group, but we’re a busy group as we continue to take on tasks around the church. Many little tasks that often go unnoticed around Zion are done by gifted hands and willing hearts. Remember that God doesn’t call the Equipped . . . He equips the called!

We are nearing the end of the calendar year and it is time to update our program books for the year 2019. Believe it or not, we have 14 committees/individuals involved in various LA/LWML capacities. Three (3) committees in particular require your assistance.

1) If you are on the Funeral Volunteer Group and have previously offered to help serve funeral luncheons, but no longer feel you are able to do so, please contact either Bev Eggers or Roxanne Pieper within the next week or two to ask them to remove you from the list of volunteers. Also, if you are not currently on the list of volunteers, but would be willing to assist occasionally at funeral luncheons, please contact either Bev or Roxanne within the next week or two

to be added to the list. The Executive Board will be meeting soon to update the program books and we'd love to hear from you!

2) Our Communion Ware Committee members are strategically selected by the LA/LWML Executive Board. Being a member of this committee requires attention to the calendar for dates when you are responsible for setting up Communion; and in addition, our group is careful to select those who will gently care for the washing and drying of communion ware and delicately care for the cleaning of the communion cloths. Feel privileged if you are asked to serve in this capacity. Being a member of the Communion Ware Committee requires that each member of this committee set up, take down, and wash the communion ware for approximately five or six communion services per year.

3) The Kitchen Committee will be asked to help clean the kitchen just one time during the year and those people will be notified of the date. It is our hope that members selected via this alphabetical rotation will be able to clean for a few hours at the date/time requested, but if not, feel free to ask someone to take your place.

Both the Communion Ware Committee and our Kitchen Committee are comprised of several members of LA/LWML along with several women of our congregation. The non-LWML members are selected in alphabetical rotation from Zion's membership roster. Please prayerfully consider saying, "yes" if/when you are asked .... "here and I, send me!"

Last, but not least, we are pleased to have two new members join our LA/LWML in the past year, Betty Klaustermeier and Martha Molnau. Won't you please consider joining us, too?

**The Congregation Christmas Potluck** will be held December 2nd following the church service. The theme this year is Christmas Jewelry.
