The Lenten Journey: Places of the Passion

The disciple named **Matthew** wrote a detailed account of **Jesus**, including the specific places and people that Jesus encountered in his ministry. Matthew presents Jesus as the Messiah (Christ) who taught and healed and who eventually gave up his life into the hands of his enemies, the Jewish leadership, who then brought Jesus to his death on the cross. His passion is intense, as his suffering is displayed at many places.

Our midweek Lenten series will contemplate **Matthew's account of our Lord's Passion**. Each week Matthew will take us to a different place where Jesus will suffer. As we meditate on the Lord's work in those places of Passion, we will discover our Lord waiting for us and willing to share with us a love that was set in place before the foundations of the world.

The scenes of Lent are familiar. The Upper Room, the Garden of Gethsemane, the halls of Pontius Pilate, and the hill of Golgotha—these are the places we remember when we meditate on our Lord's Passion. Yet when Jesus enters a place, He never leaves it as He found it. The most troubling places in our lives become the most amazing places of God's grace when Jesus visits them.

Ash Wednesday: The City of Jerusalem *

"See, we are going up to Jerusalem. And the Son of Man will be delivered over to the chief priests and scribes" (20:18)

Week 1: Bethany * Now when Jesus was at Bethany in the house of Simon the leper, a woman came up to him with an alabaster flask of very expensive ointment. (26:6-7a)

Week 2: Mount of Olives * And when they had sung a hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives (26:30)

Week 3: Gethsemane *

Then Jesus went with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here, while I go over there and pray." * (26:36)

Week 4: The High Priest's Courtyard * Now Peter was sitting outside in the courtyard. And a servant girl came up to him and said, "You also were with Jesus the Galilean." But he denied it. (26:69-70)

Week 5: Pilate's Judgement Hall *

Pilate said to them, "Then what shall I do with Jesus who is called Christ?" They all said, "Let him be crucified!" (27:22)

The Financial Report was given, approved and filed for audit. The LWML booklet for 2023 was distributed by Roxanne, who explained how the book was designed to accommodate our group's needs.

In light of the recent rescue efforts in Turkey following the earthquake, a motion was M/S/C to send our monthly Mites offering to the Orphan Grain Train to be earmarked for Disaster Relief. We dedicated our mites with the song from the booklet. It had already been decided to give January's Mites to Main Street Living for their television ministry.

Committee Reports: There were no funerals these past two months. Christian Life reports a Delegate Board meeting will be held at the end of February.

Unfinished Business: The congregation's Fish Fry will be held Feb. 24 from 3:30-8:00pm. We are encouraged to bring desserts and sign up to help, as we are able. Communion and Altar Care: Juliene mentioned that she took the altar cloth to a local cleaners to be cleaned and

pressed, at a cost of 30 dollars. Juliene also donated a supply of men's handkerchiefs to be used for communion. The group thanked her for her work on the outdoor flowers and the corner display in the lobby. Cookie Sale report that we made 100 plates that all sold, and nine of the fifteen cookie decorating kits were sold. The remaining kits were donated to the school for the children to decorate.

New Business The Martha Group is serving the 2nd **Lenten Supper**, which will be March 1st after the first service. We will use Chicken and Dumpling Soup and Clam Chowder from the Soup and Pie Supper, along with buttered bread and bars. **Our Prayer service** will be held Thursday, March 9, beginning at 9:30. Discussion was held regarding inviting the area churches that no longer have an LWML group. (We will explore this before our next years' service.) Darlene Leistiko will provide our refreshments. **The display case in May** will be in honor those who served in the Armed Forces, providing pictures of those who have a flag in the cemetery that denotes their service. We have a list to work on and Betty K offered to help Juliene with this.

We sang the birthday song for RoNaye, Pastor, and Juliene.

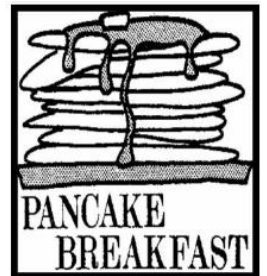
