Organization Notes for October 6th

Our hostess, Ruth Harms, served refreshments for the 12 members present. Roxanne gave a delightful devotion about laughter. Following the devotion, we recited the LWML Pledge. Pastor then led our Bible Study from the Fall Quarterly entitled, "Lord, Teach us to Pray."

The Minutes of the previous meeting were approved. The Treasurer's Report was accepted and filed for audit.

Correspondence received included a thank you from Mary Z for our payment of the registration fee for the Pastor's Wives' Retreat, which was held last weekend in Belle Plaine. She noted that ill health prevented her from attending and returned the money to the treasurer. We also received notice for an event at Church of Peace on Oct. 14, and requests for funding from Trinity First, The Dwelling Place and Southern Valley Alliance for Battered Women. A motion was M/S/C to send our \$25 monthly offering to LCMS Disaster Relief Fund for victims of Hurricane Ian. Later in the meeting, Roxanne shared details of the efforts of Trinity First to minister to their area through their school, and we gave an additional \$25 gift to their ministry. We then dedicated our Mites.

Committee Reports: Roxanne presented a detailed Share Sheet from the LWML Carver Zone Rally, Oct. 8, 2022. Highlights include:

* **LWML National Convention**, June 22-25, 2023. There will be a chartered bus at a cost of approximately \$150; you can reserve your seat by contacting Deb Vinkemeier. The MN South District will select two Young Women Reps to attend, and their application are due by Jan. 15. New Germany is eligible to select a Delegate and an Alternate to attend the National Convention. Forms for ordering convention shirts are on the LWML website. We have no vintage National convention banner to display. Again, we are encouraged to refer to ourselves as a group and not a society, as reflected in the bylaws when referencing.

* **Mission Grant Poster, Bookmark, & District Speaker List** can be found at mnlwml.org under Resources. If we have a suggestion for speakers that are not on the list, the need prior approval by a Carver Zone Pastoral Counselor and a District Pastoral Counselor. Rev. Adam Hengst from Our Savior, Excelsior is serving currently as District Pastoral Counselor for the Minnetonka Conference. Carol Henning is our new Financial Secretary.

* **Carver Zone** Bylaws and Standing Rules were adopted at the Delegate Board Meeting in August.

* **Bylaws:** Each Group in the Carver Zone needs to review, amend, and update their Bylaws. This copy of adopted bylaws should be brought to the Feb 18, 2023 Board meeting. Equalization is \$5.50 per group member and is due by Nov. 15, annual dues of \$25 due by Jan 1.

* **Spring Rally** to be held at St. Peter's, Watertown on April 22, 2023.

We are asked to bring some of our special items that we put out in our home every year, labeled and other details as you wish. Be sure and spread the word among our congregation, especially the new families to join in and make this a tradition for them as well.

Christmas gifts for the shut-ins will be purchased by Martha Molnau and Mary Zacharias, as soon as a Thrivent card arrives. If we have the items by our November meeting, we can all work to assemble them then and make plans to deliver them. For 36 years she wrote editorials, sent letters to every politician she could think of, and earned the nickname the "Mother of Thanksgiving." Finally in 1863 (during the height of the Civil War), Abraham Lincoln heeded her request.

Today, Thanksgiving is a day set aside for turkey, stuffing, mashed potatoes, sweet potatoes (maybe not), cranberries, pumpkin pie, family gatherings, football on TV, and getting ready for shopping on Black Friday. Let's see, did I forget anything? **SADLY...many people forget about GIVING THANKS.**

When I look at all the blessings that God has given to Zion Lutheran School (especially our very supportive congregation), to Zion Lutheran Church, to our students and members, and to my family, I cannot help but to humbly bow before our Almighty God in thanks and praise. I pray that we all can find time this Thanksgiving to ACTUALLY thank God, whether it be in church, around the Thanksgiving Dinner table, or during your private devotion time.
